Minutes of the December meeting were approved as presented.

District Attorney – Todd Casella

Todd reviewed his statistical report which showed year to date 447 cases were opened and 496 were closed.

Todd reported Candace Gerych was promoted to Law Enforcement Liaison and Taylor Phillips will be taking the position of Confidential Secretary to the DA. Todd is interviewing for the ADA position.

Sharon reviewed her 2020 Goals

Sharon reported with the regards to Raise the Age. The 11 county LDC group has chosen Bath as the site for the specialized secure detention. Sharon believes the next step is for the LDC to meet with OCFS to be sure of their approval and 100% reimbursement. It is believed that Steuben County would take the lead in the project, at the request of OCFS. It has not been discussed yet how the expenditures and reimbursements will work.

Sharon explained as of September 2019, the 11 counties have had 10 AOs in SSD while the case was pending, 1 AO was sentenced to SSD and 1 AO was sentenced to DOCCS facility. There are 5 SSD facilities outside of NYC.

Emergency Management – Brian Winslow

Brian reported the 2020 training schedule is almost complete. Brian and Diane are also working on some state trainings.

Brian reported there was an issue with the Middlesex Ambulance and mutual aid had to be setup for a short period of time while the issue was rectified.

Brian reported on emergency responses attended.

Brian reported he talked with Bill Kennedy in Schuyler and he feels that the two counties could share the position of the EMS Coordinator position. The Committee approved Brian looking further into a shared position with Schuyler County.

Brian reviewed his 2020 Goals.

Sheriff – Ron Spike

Ron reviewed the statistics for November 2019. Highlights follow:

Total Law Enforcement, Emergency Medical Services and Fire Department calls for service thru 911 for November were 2,205.

Ron reviewed the Jail Population report. Yates County: 36, Federal: 16 for a total of 52. Of those there are 48 males and 4 females, and the age range is 18 to 63 with 2 parole violators.

Ron reported the final bail reform released 6 inmates, 4 were released and 2 had warrants in other counties.

Ron reviewed the Revenue/Board Cost & Overtime Report which showed as of November \$322,000 had been received in revenue and the budgeted amount was \$325,000. The Sheriff will be over the targeted amount of revenue with the December figures.

Ron reported NYS DOH did an inspection of the jail kitchen and food services in December. The Jail's kitchen facility was found to be in compliance with Subpart 14-1 of the New York State Sanitary Code. Ron commended Bob Miller and the Chief Correction Officer on maintaining the cleanliness of the facility.

Ron reported there is one inmate in jail on constant watch 24X7 which requires extra staff.

Ron reported on staff openings at this time. There are 4 full time correction officer position openings and there is no Civil Service eligible list and there are 3 correction officers out on disability claims.

Ron reported on Bail and Discovery reform policy and procedures that he has put in place. Additionally discussed recent use of force issues for resisting arrest, and one man was armed, etc.

Ron reported the E911 Advisory Board will meet January 9th, 2020.

Ron reported there has been recent issues with the Bluff Point radio tower to Sherman Hollow with radio interference. Ron is checking cell towers nearby for any interferences due to the new FCC guidelines on increase of power.

Ron reported there was one arrest over the holiday crackdown on Himrod Rd where a subject parked car in a person's lawn at 1:51 a.m. and deputies made arrested for Aggravated DWI. The individual had a 0.21% alcohol reading and was slumped over steering wheel.

Ron reported the new Coroner was issued equipment and a map book.

Ron reported he will be attending the NYSSA training conference on 1/21-23 and the NYSAC conference on 1/27-29.

Criminal Justice Coordinating Council (CJCC) –

Doug stated that he will be making official appoints at Monday's Legislative meeting.

Tim reported the next meeting of the CJCC is January 8th at 3 p.m. in the Public Health Conference Room.

Acting County Administrator – Nonie Flynn

Nonie reviewed the County Project status report as it relates to Public Safety.
