Sheriff – Ron Spike

Ron reviewed the following resolutions that would be needed. The Committee approved.

1. Authorize Stop DWI services agreement with FLACRA for 2019
2. Authorize Sheriff and Chairman to sign Jail Physician services 2019 MOU
3. Authorize 2019 Agreement with PY Area Ambulance Corps for inmate med. Transport
4. Authorize Sheriff and the Chairman to renew inmate medical services agreement with S&S hospital – 2019
5. Authorize Sheriff and the Chairman to contract for polygraph services for 2019
6. Authorize Sheriff and the Chairman to sign Jail Drug Services Agreement 2019
7. Authorize Sheriff and the Chairman to renew firearms range contract 2019
8. Authorize Sheriff to fill two Correction Officers Positions

Ron reported, negotiations continue with C82 unit 9875 CBA.

Ron reported work continues on the APP for smart phones.

Ron reviewed the general agency statistics for November 2018. Highlights were:

Ron reported he delivered the Annual Jail Phone report to the County Attorney by NYSSA.

Ron reviewed a position review form for 2 Correction Officer Positions that became vacant due to retirements. The Committee approved.

Ron reported on the jail population report which showed Yates County: 31, Federals: 6 for a Total 37, of which there are 32 males and 5 females.

Ron reported the dorm is currently closed based on classification, and Buildings and Grounds are preparing the floor for painting while it is closed.

Ron reviewed the revenue reported which showed that \$106,110.57 was received over the budgeted amount.

Ron reported on mental health individuals. If S&S Memorial closes their mental health facility, the closest one would then be Clifton Spring. This would increase cost for the jail.

Ron reported all the parts for the jail showers rehab project has been received except for 2 which will be obtained later this year.

Ron reviewed the NYS DOH inspection of jail kitchen and food services report which was done in Dec. There were no deficiencies found.

Ron reported there are 2 inmates on constant watch and 1 inmate taken to Mid-Hudson Psych facility.

Ron reported the Undersheriff has spent a lot of time on policy and procedures updates. The Raise the Age issue required a lot of changes to the policies to be in compliant.

Ron reported the 911 Advisory Board met on 1/3/19.

Ron reported he went through orientation with the new coroner, Jason Johnson.
