Minutes of the February meeting were approved as presented.

District Attorney – Todd Casella

Todd reviewed his statistical report which showed for the month of January there were 36 new cases and 32 cases were closed. There are currently 257 open cases.

Todd reviewed the following resolution that would be needed. The Committee approved.

Todd reported the Revenge Porn Law was signed. This will cover a person if someone posts lude photos of someone without their permission.

Todd reported on the Red Flag Law that was signed and how this law would affect those with fire arms.

Sharon explained she has concerns with Bail Reform. This has the potential to make more work for Probation, DA's, Public Defenders, and Law Enforcement and could end up being an unfunded mandate.

Sharon reported she has put in her budget for a polygraph person. The Sheriff is doing a contract that will cover Probation and the Sheriff.

Diane reported a new State Fire Instruction was hire.

Diane reported the Box Alarm system is to come live the end of the month.

Sheriff – Ron Spike

Ron reviewed the following resolutions that would be needed. The Committee approved.

Ron reviewed the general statistics for January highlights follow:

Male Prisoners admitted: 24 Female prisoners admitted: 10 Average daily pop: 40
Total Law Enforcement/EMS/Fire Department calls for services thru E911 were 1,572 for the month.

Ron updated the Committee on the filling of vacancies. Ron explained he has hired one Correction Office and still has 2 vacancies that he is processing candidates now. Tomorrow, he is doing Deputy Sheriff Interviews in hopes of getting them in the school in April.

Ron reported the Jail Population; Yates County: 36, Federal: 5, Boarded In: 2 for a total of 43. Of those there are 36 males and 7 females.

Ron updated the Committee on SWEAP currently there are 2 participants and 2 intermittent weekend participants.

Ron reviewed the revenue/board and overtime report which showed \$6,152.00 has been received so far this year.

Ron updated the Committee on the jail shower project. Three showers are done.

Ron reported he is experiencing some issues with weapon storage that he is working on.

Ron reported he is working with Community Services for 9.41 MHL issues. He has worked something out with Finger Lakes Health on obtaining psychiatric services.

Ron report staff are working on some leads for Cold Case homicide from 2002

Ron gave a brief Power Point presentation on the State Interoperable Communications Grant and the Radio Towers and plans for back-up 911 PSAP.

Ron reported the second assistant Animal Control Officer is currently in training.

Ron reported with regards to STOP DWI, the Foundation was able to get funding and will be sharing \$6,000.

Acting County Administrator – Nonie Flynn

Nonie reviewed the Project Status report as it relates to the Public Safety.

Leslie moved to enter into executive session to discuss the employment history of an individual, and matters leading to the appointment of an individual with Committee members, Legislators, the Acting County Administrator and the District Attorney present, seconded by Bonnie.
