

Emergency Management – Brian Winslow

Brain reviewed the following resolutions that would be needed. The Committee approved.

- Authorize Chairman To Sign Agreement With Matt Kelly To Provide Services For The Recruitment And Retention FY 2018-2019 Grant
- Authorize Chairman To Sign The Yates County Multi-Jurisdictional All Hazard Mitigation Update Plan

Brain reported on various trainings.

Brain reported he is working on pump testing for this year.

Brian reported on emergency responses he attended.

Brian reported students from the EMT & 1st responder classes from last year have been testing in Brian's office and will hopefully be done by the end of the month.

Brian reported he is working on the fall training schedule.

Sheriff – Ron Spike

Ron reported there was a major issue at the Public Safety Building this morning. The whole building went down and was down for about an hour.

Ron reviewed the following resolutions that would be needed. The Committee approved.

- Authorize Sheriff and Chairman to renew Jail Barber Agreement
- Authorize 2020-21 MOU with Dundee School for SRO services
- Establish Coroner's Autopsy fees
- Resolution In Support Of NYSAC Seeking Statewide Assistance For A County To Comply With Executive Order 203

Ron reviewed the general and divisional statistics report for June 2020 explaining that some of the numbers are down because of the pandemic and courts being closed. Highlights follow:

Assist other agency: 80 Jail related: 50 Sex offenders in county: 89

Evictions: 1 Visitors to Courthouse: 325

Total Law Enforcement, EMS, and Fire Department calls for services thru E911 for the month of June were 1,948.

Ron reviewed the Jail population commitment report: Yates County: 20, US Marshals: 9 for a total of 29. Of those there are 24 males and 5 females.

Ron reviewed the revenue & overtime report as of June 2020 which showed \$211,727.50 in revenue has been received so far this year. The amount budgeted is \$325,000.00. Ron emphasized that the jail is exceeding the revenue target \$ number at the six month mark.

Ron reported jail visitation resumed as of August 1st. Visitation will be non-contact only and visitors must follow specific requirements, including completing a COVID screening prior to entering the jail, temperature check, maintain social distance, and both inmate, visitor and officer's wearing a mask at all times. Visitation will be limited to 30 minutes to allow time for

correction officers to perform sanitation requirements between visits. The jail visitation area within the jail has been modified with Plexiglas screening for added separation. The NYS Commission of Correction and the Yates County Public Health have approved the visitation plan.

Ron reported the last cycle State Commission on Correction inspection was done. They had a lot questions on policies which were ok last year, but this year they wanted some changes to wording. Ron reported that all of the adjustments were made along with two forms that they wanted some changes to and submitted. Ron is waiting for their reply.

Ron reported the new Live Scan (Indemia) instrument was installed on July 27th in the jail. Ron explained he has been waiting a year for the updated. The cost was \$14,100 and the State reimbursement should be approximately \$7,000.

Ron reported there will be four Child Passenger Safety Seat events in August.

Ron reported he has received the Navigation revenue from NYS for 2019 which was \$28,460.

Ron reported a fleet vehicle wash station was installed outside of the Public Safety Building jail entrance.

Ron reported the alternate PSAP target date for the building install was to be August 6th and 7th. However, he had to cancel the install due to the State of NY not getting United Concrete Product, Inc. the manufacturer, the proper labels. The crane RFP's were completed and the Yates County Highway Department has helped considerably.

Ron reported he sent a request to Senator O'Mara and Assemblyman Palmesano to assist on the 2018 SICG target grant. Ron explained the grant was submitted on time but he has never heard anything on the multi-million grant and notes that several million not awarded as yet.

Ron reported the Victim Impact Panel is rescheduled for September 30th. May have to do more than one session for corvid safety.

Ron reported on the seeds that are arriving from China. If someone received seeds the USDA has stated that if you are concerned you can mail the seeds to the NYS Agricultural Dept.
