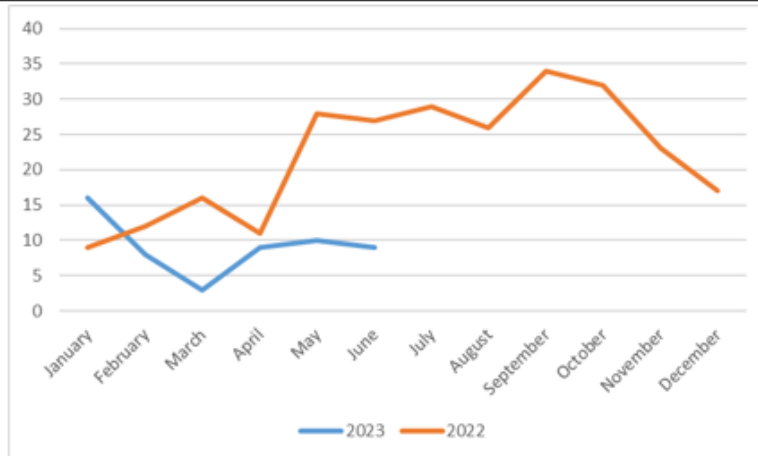

SHERIFF: Ron Spike

Ron reviewed the following resolution that would be needed. After discussion the Committee approved.

- Authorize Sheriff and Chair to Renew Jail Barber Agreement
- Acknowledge Police K9 Retirement and Replacement
- Authorize Sheriff and Chair to Execute Jail OTP treatment plan
- Authorize 2023-24 Tower Site Emergency Generator Agreement
- Acknowledge Bicentennial Monument

Ron reviewed the general monthly statistics for June 2023, noting he doesn't really see anything too remarkable from what it was June a year ago. A lot of the numbers are consistent, some up, some down. They've had more people in jail, so obviously their meals are up. They had the most phone calls into their dispatch center or outbound, inbound and outbound was 10,467 for June.

Ron reported that there are currently 30 Yates County inmates, 6 US Marshals, 2 from Seneca County, and 1 from Ontario County, totaling 39. There are 30 males and 9 females and the dormitory is presently closed.

Ron reviewed the appropriations report, the total for boarding was \$42,640.00, the total for transportation was \$1,116.80, and the total revenue as of June 2023 was \$215,418.67. Their

target for the year is \$250,000 and they need to raise \$34,581.33 more, if they continue at this rate, they will exceed the target.

Ron reported that the Commercial Washer was finally delivered and installed. They have been spending \$1,800 to \$2,000 a month taking all the laundry from the jail to a laundromat.

Ron reported that are having a current problem with not enough jail inmate tablets. These tablets can be used for visitation, educational purposes, and other things that way. It's a great tool to have in the jail. Several of them have broken and they have been in negotiations with Via Path Company trying to get some replacements. They're saying it's a supply chain issue. When they close to 40 people in jail, and they only got 16 tablets, inmates want to fight over having them. It causes lots of issues to the point where they might just stop using them all together. That's not a win for anybody to do that.

Ron reported that they've been working with Joe for new cameras and things. It has allowed them to use grant money for a new camera system in their interview room, which is required. They are working on security camera to finalize for the Sherman site.

Ron reported they did participate at the County fair, 7/11-7/15, he spoke at the Keuka Lake Association's annual meeting on 7/8, and they are participating in the bicentennial parades.

Ron reported in regards to 911 dispatch they've been having some challenging times regarding lack of manpower. They are down 3 dispatchers, which is really not good and he's worried about where that's all going to go. They're in the process of trying to do backgrounds on a couple of people to see if they can get some other people hired.

Ron reported that they are doing current training on the alarm systems for the Motorola Land Mobile Radio system and the tower systems. At the end of the month they've got training for the microwave alarm system coming up.

Ron reported that they held the State Sheriff's Association Summer Training Conference for the first time in Penn Yan 7/18-7/20. They ended up with 35 sheriffs from across the State and 30 some vendors.

Ron reported that village of Penn Yan, just settled a 4 year contract with their police department. There's such a discrepancy between what Yates County people are making in wages compared to the village police. He worries about retention and recruitment and other things like that.

COMMUNICATIONS PROJECT: Doug Paddock

Doug reported that the training on Microwave Networks' system is scheduled for the week of August 28 and the training on Motorola's system is scheduled for August 1 – 3. and the training on both Microwave Networks and Motorola systems is to be scheduled.

Doug reported that field testing to assure that radio coverage meets contract specifications began 6/26. The initial results from Motorola show greater than 98% coverage and specifications require a minimum of 95% and it is likely the final overall coverage will be closer to that.

Doug reviewed the updates for the Bluff Point, Dundee, Italy Hill, Ovid, and South Hill Towers:

- Construction dress-out has been completed at all sites where required
- Legacy microwave dishes have been disposed of
- Legacy Angus – The owner has been notified of lease termination

- Legacy Dundee – Removal of legacy shelter and equipment is complete. Radio antenna removal rescheduled until September due to protected birds
- Legacy Italy Hill – Antennas and related equipment have been removed
- Legacy Public Safety Building – Removal initiated 6/28
- Legacy Sherman – Removal was completed 6/27

Doug reported that in regards to dispatch, The Max D (CAD) software upgrade to all 6 consoles at the PSAP is complete, the Sheriff requested quotes to make the outdated Zetron desk radio at Court Security work on the new system, and all consoles are operational as the “borrowed” component part has been replaced.

Doug reported in regards to power, the 48 volt DC battery racks and batteries are scheduled to be installed at the four new/upgraded sites (Bluff Point, Dundee, Italy Hill and Ovid) during the week of 7/5, the inverters for the sites have been delayed and they are currently scheduled to ship on or about 7/7, a quote is being requested to move legacy DC power plants from existing shelters to the new Sherman equipment location, and the small UPS devices need to be procured and installed at Shay, Sherman, and South Hill for a few critical AC units.

Doug reviewed the following activities planned for July:

- Schedule systems’ training
- Complete coverage acceptance testing
- Remove legacy tower at Angus
- Install battery racks, batteries and inverters at four new/upgraded sites
- Move legacy DC power plants to Sherman location
- Procure and install small UPS devices at three existing sites
- Address any shortfalls discovered
- Complete closeout of contracts as appropriate
