September 8, 2021

Minutes of the August meeting were approved as presented.

SOLID WASTE: Connie Hayes

Connie reported she did check with the DEC on the 2019 Hazardous Waste Grant reimbursement. DEC is still working on a backlog and appreciates our patience.

Connie updated the Committee on 2021 Hazardous Waste/Electronic Collection Day event.

Discussion took place on putting a solid waste plan together. This will be given to the new Planner to do along with managing solid waste and the hazardous waste days.

HIGHWAY: Craig Prior

Craig reported the red and yellow blinking lights have been installed at the CR#2 & CR#4 intersection.

Craig reported the roadway striping of all roads was completed on August 9th.

Craig reported the RFP for the proposed facility went out on September 1st.

Craig reported he has an HEO retiring mid-October but does not have a definitive date yet.

Craig reported he has purchased (6) 1,000 gallon propane tanks and (4) 33.5 gallon forklift tanks. They have not been installed as of yet.

Craig reported the bid for propane was sent out and the opening date is September 21st.

Craig reported reimbursement has been submitted for CHIPS funding in the amount of \$1,559,288.42.

Craig reported Assemblyman Palmesano notified Craig that he will be receiving Multi-Modal funding of \$50,000 to use towards specific items.

Craig reported crews have been working on cleanup from the August 18th flooding. Craig estimates a 6 week time frame. A preliminary estimate of \$250K in damage was given to OEM.

Craig reported the 2021 Dump truck was delivered on August 31st. There is a 2005 Sterling snow & ice dump truck on the auction site.

BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS: Joe Reed

Joe reviewed the Weights and Measurers report.

Joe reported BQ Energy has applied to NYSEG for interconnection. The other projects dropped out and space has freed up on the line.

Joe reported he requested quotes from four sealcoat companies and received a price of \$5,900 from Shuttleworth Enterprises to crack fill, sealing and stiping the County lots from Liberty Street to Main Street.

Joe reviewed the following resolutions that would be needed. The Committee approved.

- Authorize Chairman to Sign an Agreement With Shuttleworth Enterprises for Parking Lot Maintenance.
- Amend Resolution NO. 239-21 (Authorize Chairman to Sign Contract for Repairs to Generator Set)

Joe reviewed a position review form for a Cleaner position which has been become vacant due to a resignation. The Committee approved.

Joe reported he has received a request to change the signage on the single occupant restrooms in the County Office Building to unisex. The Committee approved.

Joe reviewed the inspections that were done last month.
