Brian reported he attended 3 County Meetings (Public Safety, Legislature, & County Administrator) and 2 County Fire meetings.

Brian reported that the Firefighter 1 SCBA was completed and that the FAST training started in Dundee.

Brian reported that he will continue to meet about the radio project.

Brian reported that he met with Churchville Fire Equipment and set up yearly pump tests.

Brian reported that he met with PYPD & Homeland Security about Birkett Mills training & security.

Brian reported that he spoke at the 9/11 ceremony at the PYFD.

Brian reported that he participated in the County Highway walk through.

Brian reported that he coordinated the delivery of the masks for the local school districts.

Brian reported that his office has been meeting and working with DHSES & FEMA about storm damage.

Brian reported that Emergency Services Coordinator Bailey delivered masks to local schools.

Brian reported that he attended the NYSEMA meeting in Syracuse.

Brian reported on the emergency responses he attended.

Brian reported that the EMS classes have started with 32 total students. 28/32 students from Yates County.

Brian reported that he is working with dispatch on designated Loading Zones for Helicopters.

Brian reported working on gathering information on people with LVADS within the county so that their addresses can be flagged in the CAD.

Brian reported that he attended the FL REMAC meeting.

Brian reported researching Mental Health and Wellness Outreach resources for Fire/EMS.

Brian reviewed his 2022 budget summary.

SHERIFF: Ron Spike

Sheriff and Undersheriff are in training at this time. Presenting for the Sheriff is Chief Correction Officer Jared Bailey and Assistant to Sheriff Joy Jensen.

Jared reviewed the following resolution that would be needed. The Committee approved.

Joy reviewed the 2021 budget proposal synopsis for eight budgets.

Jared reviewed the monthly agency statistics for August 2021. Highlights follow.

Jared reviewed the jail population report; Yates County: 26, Federal: 11 for a total of 37. Of those there are 31 males and 6 females. There is 1 female boarded out with NYS DOCS in Bedford Hills due to medical.

Jared reviewed the appropriations report which showed \$291,377.46 has been received and \$325,000.00 budgeted.

Jared reported a Victims Impact Panel was held 9/29/21 with 31 attendees.

Joy reported the STOP plan for 2022 and budget were sent to New York State Governors Traffic Safety Counsel.

COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR: Nonie Flynn

Nonie reviewed the project status report as it relates to Public Safety.

CHAIRMAN: DOUG PADDOCK

Doug reported survey crews have been to the Italy and Dundee sites to collect topographic information for tower placement and archeological investigation.

Doug reported C & S is obtaining quotes from drilling contractors for geotechnical information and from University at Binghamton for the archaeological study.

Doug reported C & S is also obtaining a quote for movement of existing equipment to new tower sites on a temporary basis to assure that the system continues to be operational.

Doug reported Scott forwarded an agreement for the Angus site to the property owner's attorney for review.

Doug explained that Sheriff Spike forwarded the following federal statute for informational purposes and felt everyone should have this information.

Weapons Prohibition

Possession or use of firearms and other dangerous weapons on a Federally owned or leased facility, including grounds, parking lots and buildings, is illegal. 18 USC Section 930 (a) and (b) state:

"Whoever knowingly possesses or causes to be present a firearm or other dangerous weapon in a Federal facility, or attempts to do so, shall be fined under this title or imprisoned not more than 1 year, or both." (Certain exceptions apply. See 18 USC Section 930(c).)

"Whoever with intent that a firearm or other dangerous weapon be used in the commission of a crime, knowingly possesses or causes to be present such firearm or

dangerous weapon, in a Federal facility, or attempts to do so, shall be fined under this title or imprisoned not more than five years, or both."

Note: It is important to post signs of the prohibition against weapons at the entrances to Federal buildings. Agency employees should be trained to report suspected violations immediately to a building security official, a supervisor, or other appropriate authority.

Doug questioned if the Committee would be interested in having the County Administrator obtain costs for the various options that the Sheriff suggested for Security in the County Office Building. The consensus of the Committee was to have the administrator obtain costs.
