November 5, 2019

Minutes of the October meeting were approved as presented.

Zach King, Finger Lakes Regional Representative from the Governor's office attended the meeting to discuss issues and concerns that the Legislature has with the new Bail Reform Law that will be going into effect January 1<sup>st</sup>.

### **District Attorney – Todd Casella**

Todd reviewed his statistical report which showed 445 open cases year to date and 477 closed cases year to date.

Todd questioned when the resolutions to create the two positions that are funded in the 2020 budget would come forward. Chairman Paddock suggested that the 2020 budget be passed first. Resolutions could be offered at the budget public hearing or at the December 9<sup>th</sup> Legislative meeting. The consensus of the Committee was to bring resolutions forward at the budget public hearing on November 21<sup>st</sup>.

\*\*Yates County Court and Penn Yan Village Court each released two individual to Pre-trial Release directly from court who were not interviewed/screened by this department.

Summary: There were no Pre-Trial revocations during the quarter. 6 individuals were supervised by the Pre-trial Release program at the end of the quarter. There were 3 cases that were successfully closed and all were sentenced to probation.

### **Community Service**

6 people successfully completed their community service obligation this quarter. As of September 30, 2019 there were 27 active cases doing community service in 9 worksites within the county.

### **Emergency Management – Brian Winslow**

Brian reported because of other events on the day of the NYS Tier 3 meeting, he is looking at setting up another training in the spring.

Brian reported the Hazard Mitigation Plan has been submitted to NY State for review. On October 16<sup>th</sup> public comment was heard in the County Office Building. Comments were incorporated in the draft plan. After State review it will come back to him for corrective actions they deem needed before being sent to FEMA. Once approved by FEMA the Plan Adoption Resolution can be prepared. Brian explained that this is a very long process and a lot of work to put together and thanked Deputy Director Diane Caves for all her hard work in putting this plan together.

Brian reported he will be interviewing this month for the EMS coordinator position. There are 6 candidates.

Brian reported he will be attending a Recruit and Retention meeting on the 19<sup>th</sup>.

Brian reviewed emergency responses he attended.

Brian reported he assisted in live burn training.

### **Sheriff – Ron Spike**

Ron reviewed the following resolution that would be needed. The Committee approved.

- Authorize Chairman To Renew An Agreement With Emerson Network Power

Ron reported there is another approximately \$30,000 in additional revenue that can be added to the 2020 budget. This is funding from the PSAP Consolidation Grant.

Ron reviewed the Jail Population report: Yates County: 36, Federals: 9 for a total of 45. Of those there are 36 males and 9 females.

Ron reviewed the Revenue Report which showed \$259,712.46 has been received in revenue so far this year. The cost to board out a prisoner at a mental health facility has cost so far \$82,206.45.

Ron reported currently there at 6 participants in the SWEAP program.

Ron reported the Take-Back Drug event that was held on October 26<sup>th</sup> was as success. There were 91 people and 153 pounds of medication was taken in.

Ron reported he is setting up training for members on Bail Reform/Discovery reform. He has a 68 slide power point and will invite other police as well. Also discussion on the creation of the new 2020 CID position as Evidence Coordinator due to new discovery laws.

Ron reported Deputy Forshay and Smith graduated on November 1<sup>st</sup> from the Broome Police Academy and have started their field training.

Total law enforcement/EMS and fire departments calls for service through E911 were 2,555.

Ron updated the Committee on the State Interoperable Communications Grant (SICG). For the year 2017 the grant amount was \$350,954 to date \$316,000 has been spent \$34,000 has to be spent by the end of the year. Ron explained that he is working with Tim Groth on cyber security for 911. Ron explained the SICG funding for 2018 is for a PSAP backup. Ron has not heard anything on the 2019 funding, nor status of communications study.

#### **Criminal Justice Coordinating Council (CJCC) –Tim Cutler**

Tim Cutler reported the minutes of September 11<sup>th</sup> meeting have been distributed to the legislature and the next meeting is November 13<sup>th</sup> at 3 p.m.

#### **Acting County Administrator – Nonie Flynn**

Nonie reviewed the Project status report as it relates to Public Safety.
