



In 2020 you can vote in person before Election Day in each of three Elections; the Presidential Primary on April 28th, the Federal, State and Local Primary on June 23rd and the traditional General Election on November 3rd. Early Voting begins 10 days before the Election and is allowed for 9 days. Unlike an Absentee Ballot which is counted after each election, Voters can cast their ballot early and have their ballot count as an Election Day ballot. **All** registered voters are eligible to vote early.

In Yates County the Polling Site that has been established is at the County Office Building utilizing the current Clerk's Closing Room near the County Clerk's Office. This location is assessable to voters with physical disabilities. If you vote during the early voting time period, you are not eligible to vote on Election Day. Early Voting ballots will be canvased and reported AFTER 9pm on Election Day with the ballots cast at the polls.

Uniform Hours of Operation for ALL Early Voting

1st weekend - Saturday & Sunday - 9:00 AM to 2:00 PM

Monday, Wednesday and Friday - 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM

Tuesday and Thursday - 9:00 AM to 8:00 PM

2nd weekend - Saturday & Sunday - 9:00 AM to 2:00 PM

You can still vote by Absentee ballot if you are out of your home county, or if you are permanently or temporarily disabled, ill or are the primary care giver for one or more people who are ill or physically disabled, or a resident of a Veterans Hospital, or detained in jail awaiting trial or incarcerated for an offense other than a felony you may apply for an absentee ballot.
