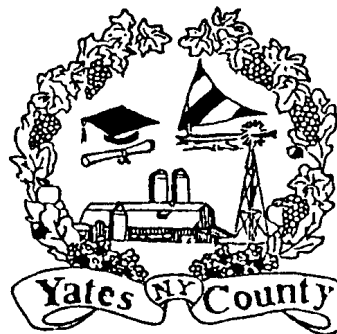

HOW TO BECOME AN ELECTION INSPECTOR

General Information

Qualifications

- Citizen of the United States
- Registered to vote in Yates County
- Available to work each election
- Anyone on the Ballot in that Town must work in a different Town

Compensation

Poll Inspectors have a base pay of \$12.24/hr. for ANY assigned work or training. Poll Site Chairs and Inspectors who must travel outside of their home town are eligible for additional compensation.

Hours to Work

- Election Inspectors start a full day shift at 5:00 AM and end at 10:00 PM to allow for site preparation and completion of post elections records and site closure.
- When necessary, half day shifts of 8.5 hours are available for some inspectors.
- Paid training sessions last from a minimum of 2 hours for annual recertification to a maximum of 5 hours to learn various specialized operations of voting machines

Responsibilities of the Election Inspectors

- Set up and take down the poll site
- Open and close the Imagecast voting machine
- Open and close the Electronic Poll Books
- Verify Voter eligibility
- Ensure the voter obtains the correct ballot
- Assist voters as needed
- Complete district Election Results paperwork and forms

Training

- Initial training is 4-5 hours; recertification training is 2 hours each year after that; and special training can be 2-5 hours.
- Manuals and check lists are provided
- Training involves lectures, videos and hands-on training with equipment.
